

Create a Paper Pieced Log Cabin Block



Quilt-Pro 5

Begin:

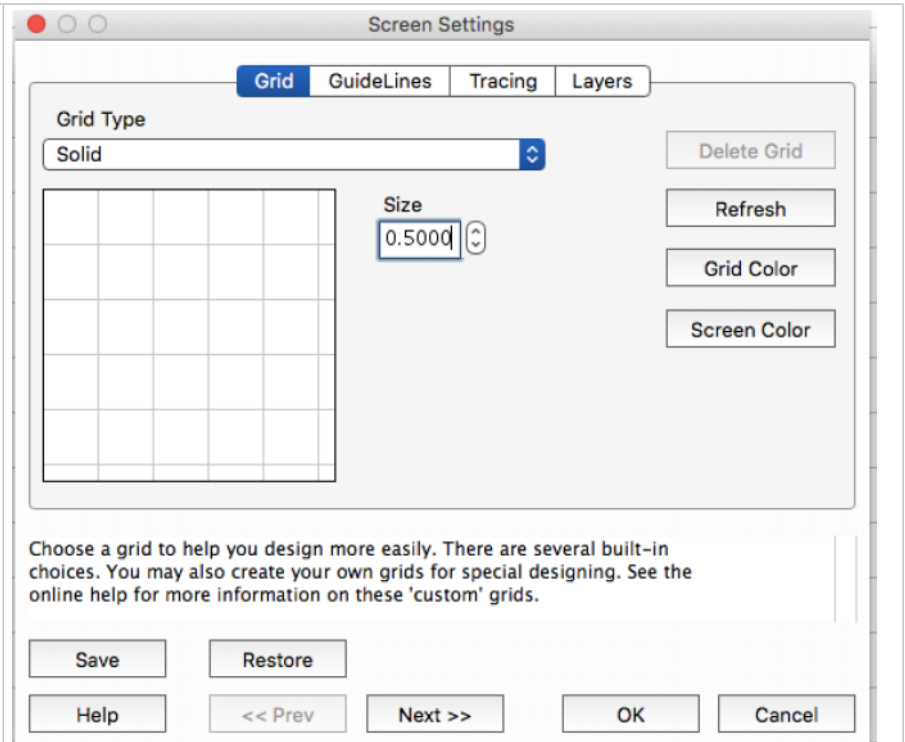
To begin, clear your screen of any open blocks and/or quilts.

From Options menu, choose Screen Settings

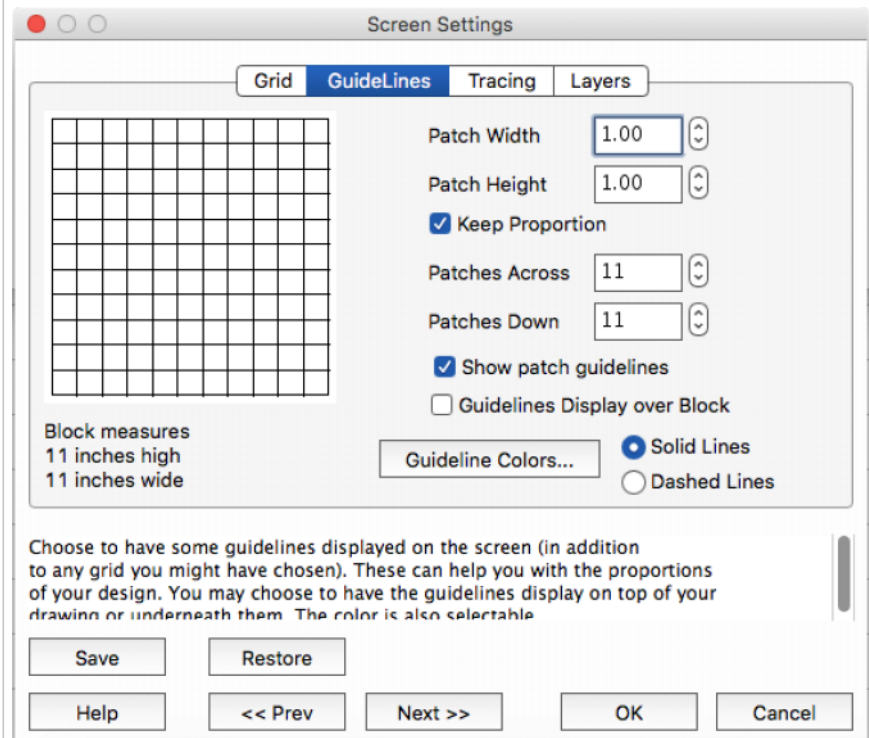
From the Options menu, choose screen settings.

Grid Type: Solid

Size: .50

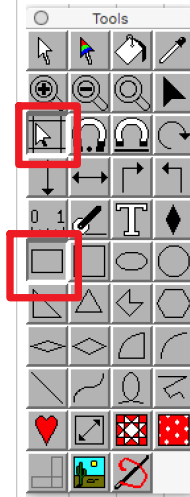


Set the patch guideline options as shown to the right.

On the Tool Bar press the Rectangle tool and the Snap to Grid tool.



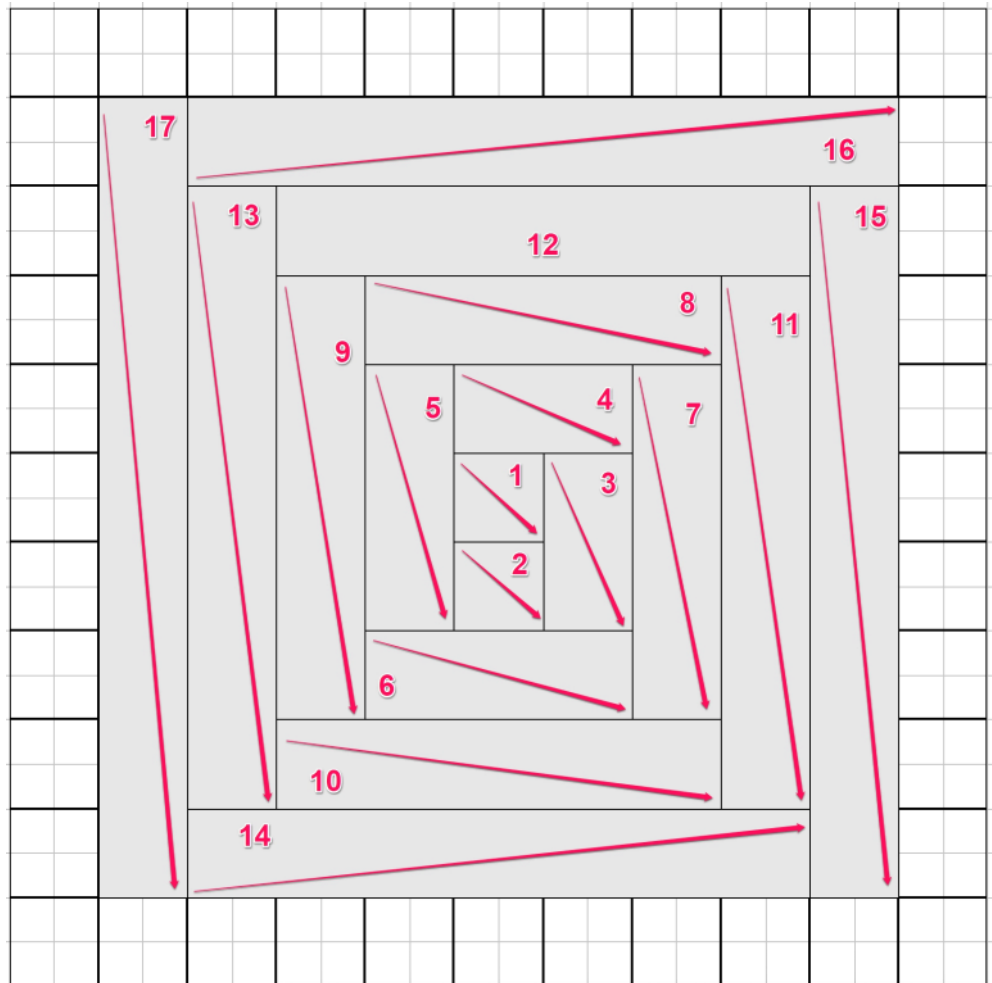
Using the Rectangle tool and the snap to grid tool, draw the first square, #1 in the drawing, as shown in the illustration. Click once to begin the drawing and then drag the cursor in the direction of the arrows. Click Again to set the drawing.

Continue in numerical order, drawing in the direction of the arrows

I left a part of the Patch Guidelines blank so you could see that I was still using them. You can continue in the same manner until it is filled or you can stop here. The Patch Guidelines are not a part of the block.

When the drawing is complete, please save.

We will cover the Foundation numbering next.



Create a Paper Pieced Log Cabin Block, cont:



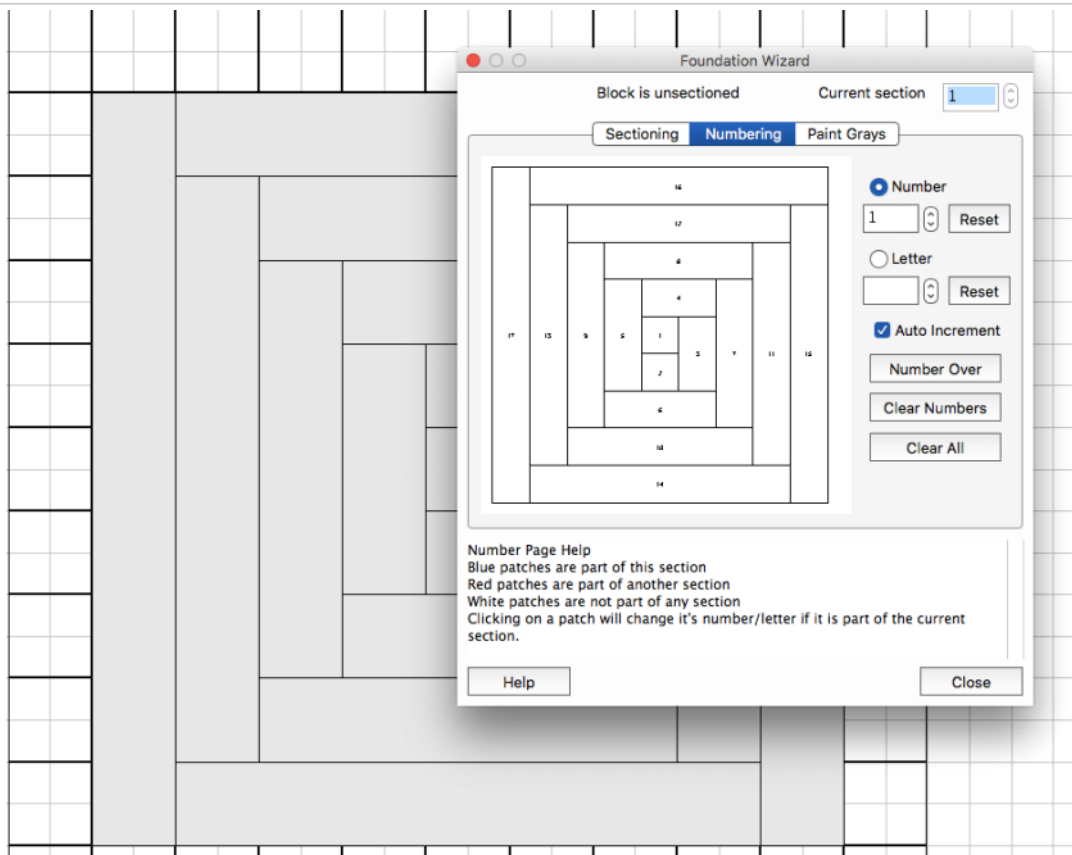

With the block drawn, click **Effects** menu and select **Foundation Wizard**.

The screen will look like this image.

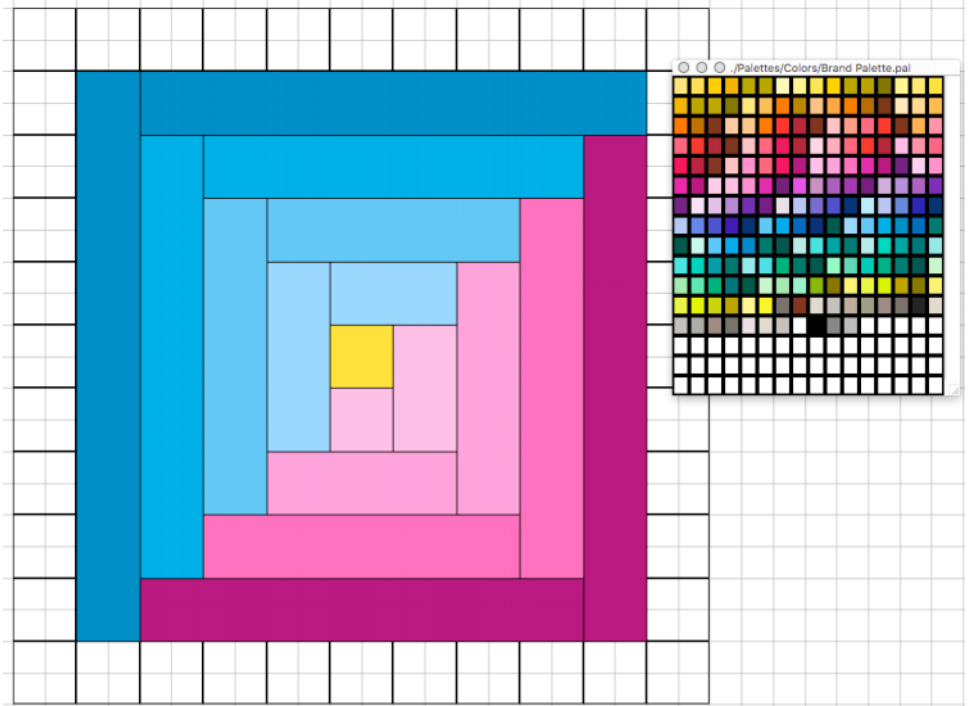
You'll notice that the block appears to be prenumbered. Quilt-Pro usually does a pretty good job of add the numbering in the correct sequence; but you should verify that it is before printing the pattern. In this case, the numbering sequence is the same as the drawing sequence but that's not always the case, so you should verify it is correct. If changes are needed, click the numbering button and start over at 1. Click each patch in drawing order.

Then click close.

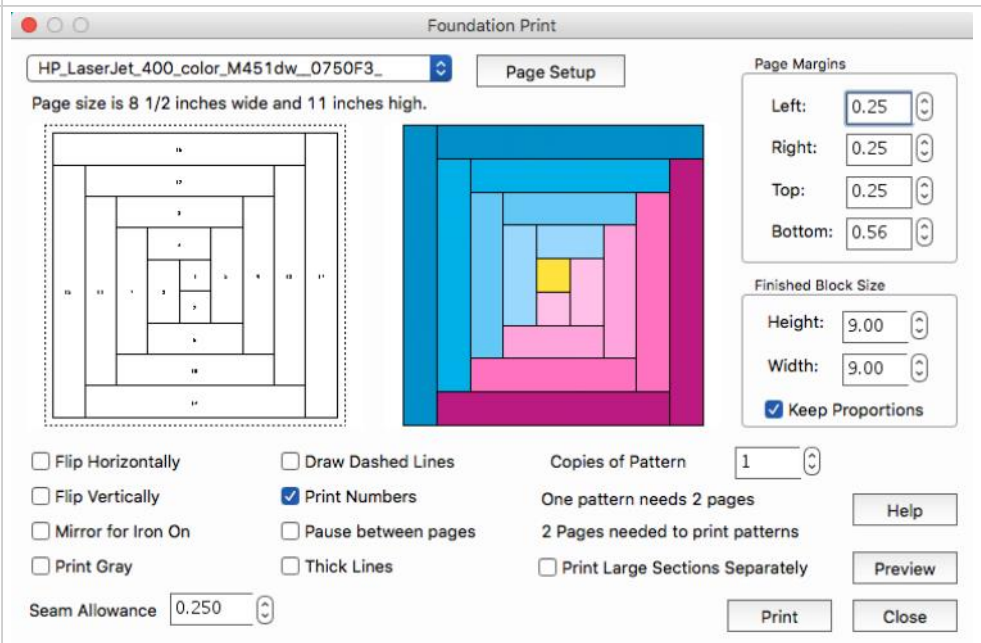


Save the block again.

To print the Foundation pattern, click the **File** menu, **Print Foundation**.

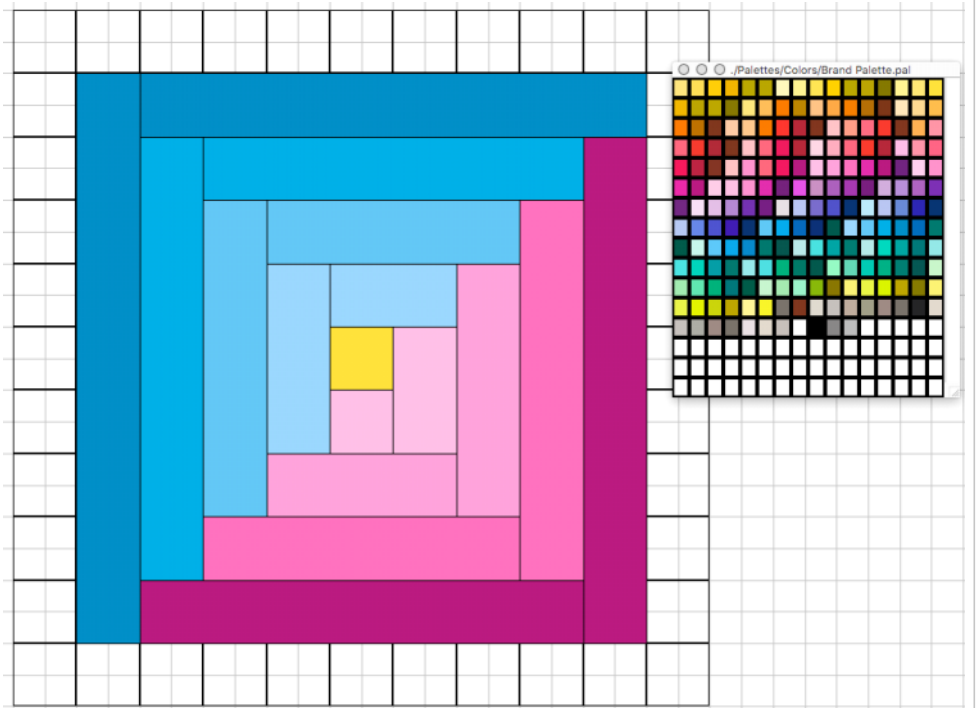
Select Print Numbers.
